







Targets

The targets below have been set following rigorous analysis of the school's performance over time. The achievement of improvement targets is measured against the school's average performance over time.

1. Preparing our students for employment and/ or training (ATTAINMENT)

By 2020, 98% of Year 12 students will achieve an ATAR of 55 or above and/or a Certificate II or higher

Maximising university placement offers
 By 2020, the percentage of ATAR students with an ATAR score of 65 or above will increase by 14%.

3. Halving the gap between whole school regular attendance and Aboriginal regular attendance.

By 2020, the percentage of Aboriginal students with an attendance rate of 90% or greater will increase by 9%.

4. Meeting the Literacy and Numeracy standard

Each year, at least 85% of Year 12 students will meet the OLNA standard.

5. Greater progress in Literacy and Numeracy

Each year, the school's average NAPLAN progress from Year 7 to Year 9 will improve by:

45 points in Writing.

60 points in Numeracy.

6. Improvements in engagement and behaviour.

By 2020, the percentage of 'Consistently' and 'Often' ratings awarded in each reporting period in the category of:

'Participates Fully' will be 80% or higher. 'Behaves Appropriately' will be 85% or higher.
