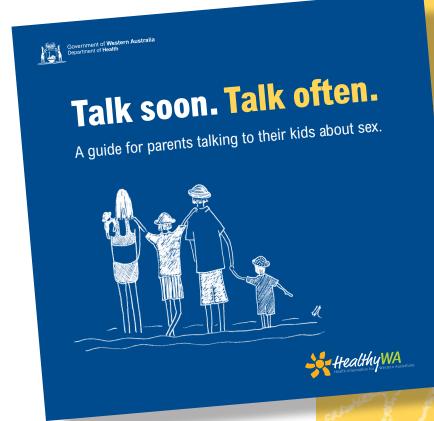


## How to talk to your child about sex
