

CONTRIBUTIONS & CHARGES

We run a varied and engaging range of subjects for students at Newton Moore SHS and encourage all parents to continue to support the school through payment of contributions and charges, as this will ensure we continue to have the capacity to provide a wide range of opportunities to our students.

Voluntary Contributions

A voluntary payment of \$235 is requested from parents and goes towards the cost of materials and equipment used by students in Years 7 – 10. Voluntary contributions are costs associated with school based resources (such as paper, specialist equipment use, chemicals, sporting equipment) that is used by multiple students and retained by the school.

Compulsory Charges

Compulsory charges are applied to high cost electives chosen by students in Years 7-10 and to all Year 11 & 12 courses. Payment of charges is compulsory. Students are able to select a combination of subjects that meet the maximum contribution value of \$235 and therefore do not attract compulsory charges. Compulsory charges are made up of costs directly used or consumed by the student and are often paid to external agencies to run the course (such as bus hire fees, entrance fees, guest speakers).

Extra Cost Optional Components

These are optional activities that are above and beyond normal education program. If selected, these costs are compulsory.

Payment Options

Payments can be made at the Accounts Office. Office hours are 8.00am – 4.00 Monday to Friday.

The school makes provision for the following payment options:

- In person at the Accounts Office with cheque, cash, EFTPOS or Credit Card.
- Over the phone with Credit Card
- Online with BPAY or EFT

 is free for Centrelink customers. Use Centrepay to arrange regular deductions from your Centrelink
 payment. You can start or change a deduction at any time. The quickest way to do it is through your
 Centrelink account online.
- Payment for excursions can now be made using Consent to Go

Addressing Issues of Non-Payment

Newton Moore takes a positive approach to collecting contributions and charges from parents. We send regular email, SMS and other correspondence to parents to advise/remind them of;

- the benefits that arise from their payment of contributions, charges and optional extras.
- available payment options including payment plans
- availability of financial assistance
- the use of external debt recovery services which are utilised in the recovery of unpaid charges.

Refunds Policy - School Camps, Excursions and Incursions

Camps, excursions and incursions are carefully costed and charged to parents based on confirmed numbers of student participating. If your child withdraws from an optional activity, only the refundable component such as meals or venue entry will be refunded. Non-refundable costs such as bus or venue hire will not be refunded.

ALLOWANCES TO HELP WITH THE COSTS OF SCHOOLING

SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME (SAS)

The Western Australian Department of Education provides an allowance to assist eligible families with secondary schooling costs. The allowance consists of two components:

Clothing Allowance \$115 paid directly to the parent or the school

Educational Program Allowance \$235 paid directly to the school

Application is made by the parent or guardian for student/s enrolled in Years 7 - 12. The allowance is paid up to and including the year the student turns 18 years of age.

Eligibility Criteria

Parent or Guardian must hold one of the following cards:

- Centrelink Family Health Care Card
- Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card
- Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card (blue card issued annually)

Parent/guardian must be the holder of a card that is valid some time during first term. The only exception to this is when a student holds their own health care card and has been declared independent by Centrelink (e.g. living away from home). In this instance, a letter of confirmation from Centrelink needs to accompany the application.

Education Program Allowance/Secondary Assistance Scheme

Successful applicants will have the Program Allowance of \$235 paid directly to the school to reduce the contributions payable by the parent/guardian in Years 7 –10 and the course charges in Years 11 and 12.

Clothing Allowance

The Clothing Allowance of \$115 is paid to the parent/guardian or the school, based on the applicants request. If payment to the parent/guardian is requested, the payment will be deposited into the parent/guardian's bank account. Payments made to the school will offset any charges on the students C&C account.

Abstudy Supplement Allowance

This funding of \$79 supplements the Centrelink Abstudy Fees Allowance and is available to parents holding a Centrelink Pensioner concession, or Family Health Care card or Department of Veterans Affairs Pensioner concession card. Payments are made directly to the school and are applied to the student's contributions in Years 7-10 and charges for Years 11&12.

How to Apply

Secondary Assistance and Abstudy Supplement forms are to be completed at the school in Term 1 of each year. Bring your bank details and eligibility cards in to the accounts office and make your application before the end of Term 1. Note that Secondary Assistance cannot be claimed as well as Abstudy.



BYOD - BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE

Newton Moore Senior High School provides a comprehensive Information Technology (IT) Infrastructure to support learning in the digital age. The school provides internet access and extensive wireless coverage across the whole school.

It is our expectation that students from all year groups bring their own device to support learning in our school. BYOD means you can bring an appropriate laptop or tablet to school and use it in classes and for study purposes.

WHATTO BUY?

Required/ Recommended Technical Specifications:

- Antivirus software Required.
- Wi-Fi, 802.llac wireless protocol Required.
- Battery life at least 5 hours of battery life Recommended.
- USB ports Required.
- Minimum screen size-at least 9.7 diagonal inches. Larger recommended.
- CPU Intel i3 or equivalent Minimum recommended.
- Windows 10 64bit OS Recommended.
- Minimum 8GB RAM Recommended.
- Minimum 256GB hard drive size larger recommended.
- Keyboard inbuilt or external keyboard if tablet Recommended.

Other Considerations

- Easy portability what weight/size can fit into my child's bag?
- A bag which is suitable for carrying and protecting your child's device.
- Sturdiness is the device going to withstand daily use, in and out of a bag, to and from school?
- · Warranty period.
- Processor capacity and memory consider what software/applications are needed.
- An external hard drive or large capacity USB Drive, so your child can backup their work from their device.
- Price-affordability is important to the family budget. Don't get talked into buying a device that has features that won't be used. Devices in the \$400-\$1000 range are adequate for most student's needs.

NOTE Smartphones are not permitted, and are unsuitable for learning activities because of their small screen size.

INSURANCE

As personal property is not covered under the school's insurance, we STRONGLY recommend that any BYOD device is covered fully under your own personal house/contents insurance arrangements. When purchasing you may also wish to consider buying an extended warranty.

CONNECTING TO THE SCHOOL NETWORK

The use of BYOD devices on the school network carries with it certain obligations and responsibilities of the student to operate the device in line with the school ICT Resources, BYOD, Mobile Phone and Online Services Acceptable Use Agreement for Students.
